
What does this mean for you and your children attending Selma City Schools?

Great news for you and your household! All enrolled students are eligible to receive a healthy, reimbursable breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your students each day of the 2014-2015 school year. No further action is required of you. Your students will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit an application.

If a la carte items are selected, each student will be required to pay for additional items at the food prices approved by our district's board of education.
