Meeting the Needs of English Learners

Process:

- ✓ All enrolling kindergarteners and any newly enrolled students are given the Home Language Survey as part of the enrollment package.
- ✓ The principal notifies the EL Coach of any students that indicate a language other than English is spoken in the home.
- ✓ The EL Coach schedules and administers the WAP-T screener. Identified students are assessed within 10 days of enrollment (30 days if during the summer)
- ✓ The EL Committee convenes to review scores, identify needs/supports, and develops an I-ELP.

The EL team meets within 30 days following the assessment.

✓ Parents may waive EL supplemental services, but NOT core instruction.



Classification & Exiting:

- The WIDA Online Screener murcates "proficient" if 1st – 12th grader scores 3.9
- W-APT screener indicates "proficient" if Kindergartener scores at or above 25 on Listening and Speaking combined.
- If, W-APT screener indicates "less than proficient", student identified as EL (English Learner)
- Student "exits" when proficiency score of 4.8 is reached on ACCESS for ELsTM
- Student placed on FLEP Monitoring for 2 years

Program T Design:



ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL) with a focus on sheltered instruction strategies- Teachers provide instruction that simultaneously introduces both language and content, using specialized techniques to accommodate a child's linguistic needs. Instruction focuses on teaching of academic content rather than the English language itself, even though the acquisition of English may be one of the instructional goals.
